ST. GEMMA'S HOSPICE

I've had a busy couple of months at St. Gemma's as your Representative on the Board of Trustees. It's great for me that Sister Susan comes along with me as an observer. It really helps to chat over what we've seen and heard. Susan really loves going and it is thanks to her that we arranged a full day actually seeing the work of the hospice.

20th April 2023 – Drinks Reception for New Donors

Susan and I attended this Drinks Reception at St. Gemma's for new Donors and Trustees. At a previous Board Meeting, the Trustees had been asked to invite anyone they knew who might support St. Gemma's. I introduced Jo Jarvis, a cousin of Sister Cecilia Wilkinson, R.I.P. who has a medical business and Jo suggested her friend, Christine Logan, the mother of the Sports Presenter Gabby Logan. They both came and sat with us.

Phil Corrigan, Chair of Trustees and Kerry Jackson CEO hosted the evening and shared details about the impact of the work of St. Gemma's in its 45th anniversary and the plans for the future. Phil showed us a picture of herself as a teenager alongside an old St. Gemma's collecting box and explained that her Parish Priest in Bradford was a keen supporter of St. Gemma's and she often went on the sponsored walk he organised to raise funds. Her Parish Priest was Canon Lyons!

We then had a presentation from a young woman Abbie Stone who was running the London Marathon for St. Gemma's in memory of her mother and father who had both died in St. Gemma's when she was a teenager and in thanksgiving for receiving 8 years of bereavement counselling and support. Everyone was asked to donate and I donated £50 on behalf of the Province (PLT).

25th April 2023 Spiritual Care Integration Group

This meeting was attended by Kerry, Laurence, Laura, Barry, Fr. Dennis, Susan and myself. After much discussion and a PowerPoint presentation from Laurence, we agreed to form two groups; strategic and operational as the meetings had become too big with representation from all the hospice departments. Basically, we need to equip people, dealing with patients, how to give Spiritual Care which is different for all. The Operational group will be those directly involved in training and the Strategic group will ensure that training is happening. Next meeting in 6 months.

4th May 2023 - Day at St. Gemma's

Susan and I spent the whole day from 8.30am being introduced to all the aspects of the work of St. Gemma's.

We visited Community Outreach, (250 Patients on the books!) They had two free beds in the Inpatient Unit and 3 people who were desperate to come in. We then attended the Triage meeting where they made the difficult decision which of the 2 of the 3 patients would be admitted. We popped into a meeting of out-patients and took part in Angel Signs where we each took an Angel label with a word written on the reverse. It was amazing how the words resonated with each patient. Mine was LOVE and I remembered how the logo for St Gemma's was 'Love Knows No Measure' and it felt perfect for that day as we were seeing all the love around us. We then quickly popped into the meeting next door which was for the carers of the patients we had just seen. They told us how wonderful the support given at St Gemma's is.

We were introduced to most of the Staff and they explained their work. At lunch time we were treated to lunch in the bistro and they had put table cloths on for us!

In the afternoon, we met with Trish Stockton head of the Academic Unity of Palliative Care who explained their amazing educational work.

Finally, we met with Kerry and thanked her for allowing us to have such an amazing insight into the work of St. Gemma's.

When we first arrived we were told of a young woman who had been admitted to the Inpatient Unit the day before for a global check on her medication but during the day her condition deteriorated very quickly. She told the staff that all she wanted to do in her last days was to get married! So the staff got in touch with her fiancé and then set about arranging a wedding. Registrars were contacted, staff went out for flowers, food was produced, the conservatory was festooned with lights and that patient's last wish was granted all thanks to the caring, loving and amazing staff at St Gemma's!

It was an amazing experience. I was greatly impressed by the commitment of the Staff and the overall peaceful, yet very busy atmosphere. Everyone was trying to do their best in some very difficult circumstances. I really felt that I had touched the beating heart of St. Gemma's.
