

Today, February 6<sup>th</sup>, is the first public holiday being held in Ireland in honour of St Brigid. You will notice that the Le Chéile logo is in the shape of the St Brigid's Cross and the lines signify keys to learning and the search for truth.

Members of the religious congregations involved in the Trust, as well as school principals and board members, attend this

conference. What is unique about Le Chéile is that two pupils from every school are also invited. They have separate workshops etc and also prepare a prayer ritual in which we all



take part. The names of the founders of all the congregations are chanted individually by a pupil, as a litany, and all respond, for example - 'Elizabeth Prout - lover of the poor: pray for us'.
