My nephew Bernard has been included in the prayer list for quite a while.

Eighteen months ago, with five tumours on his spine, he was diagnosed with Myeloma. Since then his treatment has consisted of many, many sessions of chemotherapy, extraction of cells and, after a time, replacement of these cells.

Very recently, Bernard met with his consultant who had all test results at hand and gave him the good news that, at present, he is in **remission** as there is no sign of Myeloma in the bones!
