About six miles from Maastricht, in the Netherlands, lie buried 8,301 American soldiers who died in "Operation Market Garden" in the battles to liberate Holland in the fall/winter of 1944. Every one of the men buried in the cemetery, as well as those in the Canadian and British military cemeteries, has been adopted by a Dutch family who mind the grave, decorate it, and keep alive the memory of the soldier they have adopted. It is even the custom to keep a portrait of "their" soldier in a place of honour in their home.

Annually, on "Liberation Day," memorial services are held for "the men who died to liberate Holland." The day concludes with a concert. The final piece is always "Il Silenzio," a memorial piece commissioned by the Dutch and first played in 1965 on the 20th anniversary of Holland's liberation. It has been the concluding piece of the memorial concert ever since.

This year the soloist was a 13-year-old Dutch girl, *Melissa Venema*, backed by André Rieu and his orchestra (the Royal Orchestra of the Netherlands). This beautiful concert piece is based upon the original version of taps and was composed by Italian composer Nino Rossi.

Dear Sisters,





THE SPIRITUALITY OF VENERABLE MOTHER MARY JOSEPH OF JESUS, ELIZABETH PROUT CP

Following the teaching of her Passionist friends: Blessed Dominic Barberi, Venerable Father Ignatius Spencer, Father Gaudentius Rossi and other Passionists, Venerable Mother Mary Joseph's spirituality was, of course, the **MEMORY OF THE PASSION**, as taught by St Paul of the Cross. Paul used the word 'memory' in the Scriptural sense of reliving, actually participating in, re-experiencing, in one's heart. The heart of Paul's spirituality was the Holy Eucharist. He saw Our Lord's institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper as the commencement of His Sacrifice on Calvary. He saw the Mass as the living Memorial of Christ's Redemptive Sacrifice.

Suffering, of course, was not an end in itself. It was Our Lord's Love that had redeemed the world. Human suffering had meaning only as a loving participation in Our Lord's Passion. Paul, and following him, Venerable Mother Mary Joseph, saw the reception of Holy Communion at Mass as an encounter with Our Lord in love and abandonment, because, by participating in the Eucharistic Feast, the believer shared in



both the Death and the Resurrection of Christ. The Holy Eucharist brought Our Lord not only into the centre of their lives but also into their hearts.

Paul saw the Passionist vocation as an identification with Christ in His Passion, in union with Christ in the Holy Eucharist. That meant that the Passionist lifestyle must be radically evangelical. Paul committed himself and his followers to a community life of poverty, modelled on Our Lord's emptying Himself of His Divinity in His Incarnation, Passion and Death; to a life of chastity and obedience as a total oblation in union with the Holy Eucharist; to a life of prayer, living in union with God; and in their active apostolate to a life of awakening and keeping alive the 'Memory' of the Passion. The Passionist lifestyle was both contemplative and active. To sustain such a life, Paul found strength in the Holy Eucharist and in the help of Mary, given to us on Calvary.

So did Venerable Mother Mary Joseph: in her prayer-life; in her apostolate in education in Manchester, Levenshulme, Ashton-Under-Lyne, Blackbrook and Sutton; in her Homes for working girls; in her sewing classes and night schools during the Lancashire Cotton Famine; and most of all, of course, in her founding a Religious Congregation to continue her spirituality and her apostolates, not only in the Manchester and Sutton areas, nor merely in Ireland, Scotland and Wales, but in Bulgaria, North America, Chile, Argentina, Peru, in Sweden, in Romania, in Vietnam and in Australia.

Two years before she died she wrote: A cross, no cross where Jesus; with Jesus crosses are my bliss. Why should the cross so frighten me, when on the Cross my God I see.
